On June 13, Arizona's *Get on the Bus* program celebrated a moving chapter of compassion, presence, and hope by reuniting children with their incarcerated fathers at Whetstone Prison. Families from both Tucson and Phoenix came together for a day filled with joy,

A Morning of Anticipation

The day began at the Cathedral, where a joyful space welcomed families with music, food, decorations, and crafts. Fifteen children, ten caregivers, and ten volunteers gathered in

anticipation, joined later by Phoenix families whose participation doubled this year's event.

Deacon Mike, the Diocese's Prison Ministry Coordinator, provided invaluable

guidance, while Eva Hidalgo led craft tables where children poured their hearts into handmade Father's Day cards.

Excitement bubbled as the children changed into their matching *Get on the Bus* T-shirts. Laughter and music filled

Volunteers including Donna Opsatnick, Chris Kvidera, JoAnn Weston, and others welcomed families, ensuring everyone felt at ease. Gift bags were distributed with age-appropriate items, sparking delight—Antonio's joyful cry of "I love Play -Doh!" captured the spirit of the morning.

Katie Woodward, *Get on the Bus* AZ leader, coordinated the Phoenix contingent, while Project Cross generously provided lunch. Photographer Chris Auclair captured candid moments of anticipation before families boarded the bus.

Arrival at Whetstone Prison

After a short ride, families were warmly welcomed by Whetstone staff. Deputy Warden Mormon—



himself a father of seven—was instrumental in expanding the program this year to include Phoenix families. Commanding Officer Inclan photographed each family, ensuring every participant left with a keepsake of their visit.

Inside the visitation room, emotional reunions unfolded. Some children embraced fathers they had not seen in years. Fathers and children played

An Afternoon of Connection

All around the room, heartfelt connections blossomed—tears mingling with laughter as cards were exchanged, hands were held, and families made memories to last beyond the day. For many, this was the only visit of the year, and the tenderness was profound to witness.

When the time came to say goodbye, hugs lingered and words of love were exchanged through tears. Though the parting was bittersweet, the day radiated hope, reminding all present that love endures, even across prison walls.

That was a very special day for them."


Looking Ahead


Conversations have already begun about expanding *Get on the Bus* even further. This ministry

I am incredibly proud to share that our Layettes Program is thriving! This fiscal year, we have distributed 691 layettes—a 15% increase from last year.



Christ Child Society Expands Literacy Through Book Vending Machines - Deb Auclair

This August marked two joyful milestones for the Christ Child Society of Tucson (CCST) and its Literacy Committee, as two brandnew book vending machines were installed at Immaculate Heart Academy and St. Ambrose School. These colorful, interactive

machines, manufactured by Global Vending Group, allow students to receive a brand-new book they can keep forever, helping to address a sobering reality: more than 70% of low-income households have no books at home.

Immaculate Heart Academy - August 8, 2025

The first installation took place at Immaculate Heart Academy, made possible through funds donated by Santa Catalina Catholic Church. Father Vu, who has "adopted" Immaculate Heart as Santa Catalina's school, regularly supports the students by hosting pizza days during Catholic Schools Week and celebrating Masses throughout the year.

At CCST's April fundraiser, Father Vu generously matched the amount requested by the Literacy Committee, making this gift possible.

Twelve CCST members attended the ribbon-cutting ceremony, where students eagerly demonstrated the machine. Tokens triggered cheerful messages like "One book, coming right up!" and "Enjoy your book!" Principal Sister Veronica Loya expressed heartfelt gratitude, explaining how the teachers will award raffle tickets to



students who demonstrate good behavior, academic excellence, and leadership. Each month, two raffle tickets from every class will be drawn to award students tokens to choose books.

St. Ambrose Catholic School - August 22, 2025

Just two weeks later, CCST celebrated again with the installation of another machine at St. Ambrose School on Tucson Boulevard. Founded in 1949, St. Ambrose currently serves 217 students in Pre-K through 8th grade.

Frances also served as a Reverend at the Temple of Universality.


