

### Letter from the President

These past few months have given CCST a tremendous opportunity to help children in Tucson. In September we hosted the National Christ Child Convention at Lowes Ventana Canyon. Tucson's hospitality and scenery was on full display and several attendees mentioned that this was the best convention they had ever attended. CCS Tucson's own Angela Schneider was inducted as the President of the National Christ Child at the convention!

In October we held the National Day of Service and



collected and donated over 1,500 books to children. Our Tucson Chapter found a need and filled it. We did our part for this Day of Service by helping reestablish the library at Our Mother of Sorrows (OMOS) Catholic School. What we were taught at the NCCS convention was to "... get the word out, develop your elevator speech and 'talk up' Christ Child whenever you get the chance." The Bishop's article about her showcased the Christ Child. Deb got a call from a retired teacher, Cassandra, with 30 years of books ready to find a home with children who could use them. She called Deb who connected her with Shakenya and the rest of the story is continued inside this newsletter.

### National Christ Child Society names Tucsonan as Board President at National Convention in Tucson

One heartfelt gift to a child in need blossomed into the second oldest Catholic charity in the United States. The National Christ Child Society (NCCS) was founded by a young woman who devoted her life to serving children in need, even during her own paralysis and other challenges. Mary Virginia Merrick was "fueled by her vision of seeing the Christ Child in every child — and treating each child accordingly" (NCCS).

Named Servant of God in 2003, Mary Virginia Merrick said, "When I read 'She wrapped him in swaddling clothes,' I longed to do the same, and Christ Himself taught me that I might still



do so in the person of His poor, and a great desire was born within me to go out and find the poor that I might find Him."

Over the past 135 years, this vision has grown to 45 chapters across the Nation, including 5,600 volunteers who contribute 400,000 hours of service to more than 75,000 children and their families annually. Chapters in cold climates often host coat drives for kids, and many chapters encourage literacy through reading programs in school, collecting books, or tutoring. While each chapter can direct their efforts towards a variety of needs, they all develop layette baby bundles with essentials for newborns.

The Tucson chapter has been making a difference in the lives of local children for the past 51 years. Currently with 36 members in the local chapter, recent projects include:

- Hosting a Christmas party for the preschool students at Pio Decimo
- Making bags for children in foster care
- Raising money for Santa Catalina Parish for

snack packs to fill the refrigerator for the hungry children

- Funding a new reading and comprehension program and a nutritious snack initiative at San Xavier Mission School
- Facilitating the donation of a Book Vending Machine to Santa Cruz Catholic School

Each year, the National Christ Child Society gathers for their National Convention. This year, the convention was hosted in Tucson! Coincidentally, the newly installed Board President of the National Christ Child Society is from Tucson. Angela Schneider has served in Tucson since 2012 and was the local president for four years.

"I love the mission and what I do for others though Christ," said Angela. "We're serving – that's the bottom line. It's a God thing. Every time I turn around, God is working – working through us to provide for these families."

Angela also helped to launch the newest chapter in Oahu, Hawaii, after she met some Hawaiian students attending the University of Arizona. "It was so exciting to see a young couple helping those in need," said Angela. "They want to mentor kids about careers and encourage them to do something, which is better than nothing."

Angela brainstorms ways that the Tucson chapter can continue serving the children of our Diocese throughout changing times. She also hopes the Christ Child Society can be a resource to parishes as they establish their new Walking with Moms in Need programs. "In order to keep this going another 50+ years, we need to adjust," she said. "We're willing to work with anyone in the capacity that they're willing to volunteer."

# Santa Cruz School receives Book Vending Machine from the National Christ Child Society

visited Santa Cruz Catholic School
for the ribbon cutting and dedication of a new Book Vending Machine donated by the National
Christ Child Society.

Theresa Dolan Dixon, the new Principal of Santa Cruz, led the dedication with a prayer. "Bless

these books and grant that all who use them grow in



wisdom and grace before you and your people."

"The Book Machine is wonderful!" said Principal Dolan Dixon. "It's a blessing and has sparked a lot of curiosity from our students." How does a Book Vending Machine work? Each teacher sets their own classroom goal for students to earn tokens. Some classes have a reading goal while others have a grade goal. Some students with individual learning needs have their own individual goal. "We're really giving the teachers the power in setting the goal and giving the tokens to the students," the principal explained. "Then the students come choose a book from the Machine. The book is theirs to keep forever, though



want. We're providing our students with something that they might not have. It's an exciting time. We are encouraging lots of reading at Santa Cruz!" The Tucson Chapter of the Christ Child Society has supported Santa Cruz Catholic School in the past as well, having previously fundraised for Chromebooks and a new Science Lab. Angela Schneider was just named the National Board President but has led the Tucson Chapter for the

past few years. "I want to thank Santa Cruz for being so open. It was God's plan that the Book Vending Machine ended up here. I'm happy that all the children will be able to benefit from it, from the Christ Child Society."

"Thank you, from the national level all the way down to the local level, for all that you've done to make this possible for our students," said Mrs. Dolan Dixon. "The local chapter has committed to provide funds for replenishing the books throughout the years. This will continue to be a great thing because of the work that you've done here. I thank you immensely for that."



### NCCS Annual Appeal


Over the past year, CCST continues to benefit from being a part of a national organization. We are one of 45 chapters throughout 22 U.S. states. A portion of our member dues goes to National. Being under their umbrella we receive information about fundraising, communicating with potential donors, help recruiting new members, etc. Specifically, the NCCS gave CCST \$1,500 to use towards nutrition. We gave that money to San



Xavier Mission School. The Business Office at San Xavier said they are holding the nutrition money because they plan on reopening. They also they said if they do not open they will return the money to us so we can give it to another school.

In September of this year, NCCS also gave CCST \$5,000 for the book vending machine that was given to Santa Cruz School. All in all, National does a lot for us.

One of the Wing's volunteer seamstresses from Santa Catalina Church, Lourdes, is a friend of Renee's and happened to show her the Wing's drawstring bag. Now Lourdes sews about 10 drawstring bags per month!

young ages and are appreciative for being given something they can call their own. Lourdes wanted Renee to meet Deb and see if CCST could support the Children's Advocacy Center.

Renee had only one request - that the bags be a little bigger. They are currently 16" x 18". They can be made 18" x 22" and still get two bags out of a yard of fabric. Deb made a larger sized bag and gave it to Renee. Renee told her that this size was just perfect! The reason for the increased size was that the Children's Advocacy Center adds



shoes and clothes to plastic grocery bags and these larger bags will be perfect for the children. Deb got Board approval of going for-



ward with this.

The Board approved/ CAC would like to begin receiving drawstring bags in January 0f 2023. Action: need help making the larger size bags. I have 7 months' worth of the smaller bags thanks to many talented seamstresses. The Plan is to start at starting at 20 / month (although they serve 100 children per month). Items included will be a blanket, hygiene items, cards, towel and water bottle. Pat Lunsford told me that this was the first agency Wings partnered with when the program originated in the 1970's.

### Literacy / National Day of Service
