# CCST 2024 Year in Review & April Fundraiser

CCST will be holding its annual fundraiser on Sunday, April 27, 2025. We are hosting a luncheon at The Heritage Highlands of Dove Mountain. Invitations will be available online and mailed out on March 15th.

As you prepare your 2024 taxes, there's still time to take advantage of CCST's status as a Qualified Charitable Organization (QCO). Our QCO code is #22131. Thank you to those who have already considered us for this credit!

#### A Look at What We Accomplished Together in 2024

## Would You Consider Supporting CCST this tax season at a net \$0 Cost to You? St. Mark the Evangelist Feb 2, 2025 Bulletin Article

As we approach the 2024 tax season, there is an incredible opportunity to support vital charitable organizations in our community—without spending an extra dime! Arizona's tax credit programs allow you to redirect the money you already owe in state taxes to qualified organizations, at no additional cost to you.

Several organizations supported by St. Mark and its parishioners are approved by the State of Arizona to receive these tax credits. This is in addition to any CTSO (Catholic Tuition Support Organization) donation you may already be planning.

#### Here's How It Works:

Support a Ministry: Select one or more approved Qualifying Charitable Organizations (QCOs) from the list below (see AZ Dept. of Revenue for additional organizations), along with their 5-digit codes.

#### Maximum QCO Credit for 2024:

\$470 (single, married filing separately, or head of household)

\$938 (married filing jointly)

Deadline: April 15, 2025.

Enter the Code: Use Arizona tax form 321 to enter the code and donation amount. Cash donations are eligible for tax credits on your Arizona Personal Income Tax Return.

By participating, you ensure your tax dollars go directly to causes that reflect your faith and values while supporting those in need. 🕆

We are very thankful that many people have helped CCST increase our outreach by 45% over the last 2 years. They have taken advantage of AZ's tax credit now that we are a Qualified Charitable Organization QCO.

When you donate the Christ Child Society of Tucson you can reduce your AZ state tax obligation by the same amount. The Arizona QCO state tax program deductions (see table below) come directly off the taxes you owe. For example, if you owe \$1,000 in state tax and are married filing jointly, you can donate \$938 to CCST (22131) and you will pay the state only \$62!




#### Christ Child Society Brings Christmas Cheer to Tucson School Children



These children, ranging in age from 6 to 14 years old, each received a homemade drawstring bag thoughtfully filled with customized gifts tailored to their needs and interests.

The boys each received a jacket, a blanket, a game, and/or earbuds.

The girls each received a jacket, a Lego flower kit, and a blanket.

This year, thanks to the incredible generosity of one of our dedicated members, Karen Znamenacek -Baker, each child also received a wonderful, ageappropriate toy—adding even more excitement to their Christmas. The generosity was so overwhelming that each child received two large bags filled with Christmas surprises!

Additionally, Chris Wells and CCST member Marcia Wells played a key role in securing 50 coats from St. Mark The Evangelist's Knights of Columbus, all of which were distributed to children in need, ensuring they stayed warm during the winter months.

#### What is a Kinship Family?

#### From Collection to Care: The Journey of Hygiene Kits for Children in Need

When it comes to making a difference in the lives of children, every small effort adds up to something significant. Recently, through the generosity of Santa Catalina Parishioners, the Christ Child Society received a substantial donation of essential hygiene items, including over 40 blankets, 150 tubes of toothpaste, more than 500 toothbrushes, and over 300 pairs of boys' and girls' underwear. But collecting these items is just the first step in a process that ensures they reach the children who need them most.

#### Sorting and Organizing: A Labor of Love

Once the donated items are collected, they are transported to our storage unit, where a dedicated team of Christ Child Society members and volunteers carefully count and categorize each item, ensuring that everything is properly inventoried and ready for distribution.

Each piece—whether it's a warm blanket, a tube of toothpaste, or a fresh pair of underwear—is more than just an item. It represents comfort, dignity, and care for a child who may be facing difficult circumstances. Volunteers work diligently to ensure that all items are in good condition and properly organized for efficient packing. Items we can't use are given to other agencies CCST

Every drawstring bag is carefully packed, containing items our agency partners recommend for a teen's health, hygiene, and well-being.

The impact of these hygiene kits goes beyond just providing necessities—they give children a sense of confidence and selfworth. For many, something as simple as a fresh toothbrush or a clean pair of underwear can make a significant difference in their daily lives.

Without the kindness of donors and the hard work of our volunteers, these hygiene kits would not be possible. 
